Refrigerator not cooling?

- A large quantity of warm groceries placed in an empty fridge takes approximately 12 hours to adequately cool.
- · Keeping the doors closed as much as possible during the first few hours is helpful.
- Cool perishable items first. Place canned drinks, larger items, etc. in an ice chest and move to the fridge within a few hours.
- Keep the fridge control settings on MEDIUM at all times for optimum cooling. If controls
 are set to maximum, defrost cycle can occur, and cause the coil to freeze and the fridge will
 not cool. It may take 18-24 hours to compensate for this defrost cycle.
- Keep in mind that the doors have been open during cleaning, and you have had the doors open while stocking your fridge. It will take some time for the fridge to cool back down.

A/C not cooling?

- Keep in mind that the doors have been opened most of the day. Keeping the doors closed as much as possible during the first few hours is helpful.
- Keep the thermostat set at 70. If it is set too low it will freeze up the unit causing it to not work at all.
- Make sure all windows, blinds, and curtains are closed. (While trying to cool and during the heat of the day.)

Dishwasher not working properly?

- · Check to see if a dish is in the way of the door closing or the sprayer.
- · Check to see if the soap door is closing & opening correctly. If not, try cleaning it.
- · Check for (and remove, if needed) any debris from the drain.

Dryer not drying?

- · Check to see if the lint filter is clean.
- · Check to see if the hose is clogged or kinked.



Garbage disposal not working?

- Do not place the following items in the disposal: onion peels, shrimp peels, crab shells, popcorn, bones, celery, coffee grounds, or eggshells.
- · Citrus peels, Dawn, and ice cubes will help clean and deodorize.

Various electrical items not working?

- · Check to see if they are plugged in.
- Try unplugging and plugging again to reset it.
- · Check breaker box.
- · Check the light bulb.

Issues: Report all maintenance issues promptly by calling **251.861.3311**. Just as they might occur at your own well-maintained home, mechanical failures and other breakdowns could occur. Every effort will be made to correct the situation; however, no refunds or rate adjustments will be made for mechanical failures.

Damage: Report any damage or breakage upon occurrence by calling **251.861.3311** so the matter can be settled before departure. Damages found by inspection crews upon departure will be billed and full payment for repairs will be collected via credit card.

ACP Vacation Rentals has emergency maintenance service available 24/7 for *TRUE EMERGENCIES* concerning the rental unit. Please understand that not all repair services are available 24/7 and will be called out to the unit accordingly and as soon as their business hours allow.

- Beach awareness- shoes are recommended while on the beach. While every effort
 has been made to keep the beach clean there may still be items buried in the sand or
 washing in from the gulf that have not been discovered.
- · Please leave only your foot prints on the beach! Help us keep our beaches clean.
- · Remember turtles nest in the area so please do not disturb them.
- Please...no motor driven vehicles on the beach. The dunes are a vital source of protection against erosion.
- · NO fireworks or open fires allowed on the Island.

House Etiquette

- Our rental properties are privately owned and reflect the tastes of its owner(s); therefore, please do not rearrange the furniture.
- · Please do not take bath towels, sheets, blankets, or deck furniture to the beach.
- · Please use BBQ grills on the ground level only and clean the grill after use.
- · Please make sure vertical blinds are in the open position prior to sliding them.
- Please remember to place trash in plastic bags and dispose of it prior to leaving in the designated receptacle.
- · Please do not change refrigerator/freezer settings as they are set for maximum efficiency.
- · Please do not smoke in the home.
- · Please respect your neighbors by keeping the noise down to a minimum.

Vehicle Safety

- · Feel free to park under the house if space is provided, and soft sand is not present.
- · Do not park on the streets unless the space is marked as designated parking.
- · Stay on driveways when parking as the sand is very soft and you will get stuck!
- Watch your speed on the island! There is a lot of foot traffic, children, bicycles, and golf carts.
- During extremely high tide or strong storms the beach and some of our roads may flood. ACP will make every effort to keep you informed of any such occurrences that may be coming our way.



We hope you have enjoyed your stay on Dauphin Island. Below is a list of reminders and guidelines to help with the departure process.


Check-out time is no later than 10:00 am CST

- · Start a load of dishes in the dishwasher with detergent packet provided.
- Start a load of towels with the detergent provided.
- Dispose of used items in refrigerator.
- Bag and remove all garbage from home, please place trash in outdoor trash cans or on-site dumpster.
- If the grill was used during your stay, each guest is responsible for cleaning grill after use. After coals have cooled, please place in outdoor trash can.
- Remember to check all drawers/closet before you leave to ensure you pack all your belongings.
- Lock doors/windows. Due to property security, guests will be charged a \$65.00 re-keying charge for any lost keys.

Please return any keys/ gate cards to our office & text 251-325-6077 with "checkout". If office is closed, there is a lime green drop box beside our front door to place the keys.

Rip Currents

The Gulf Coast's captivating beaches are a must-visit but beware of rip currents. They are the top beach-related danger, surpassing floods, tornadoes, lightning, and hurricanes in combined fatalities. Rip currents are powerful, narrow channels of water pulling swimmers away from shore. These swift currents often form near sandbar breaks, inlets, jetties, and piers, and they can quickly sweep both adults and children from shallow waters. If caught in a rip current, don't panic. Instead of swimming directly back to the shore, **swim parallel** to it to escape the current's pull. Please pay close attention to warning flags when at the beach, as your safety depends on it. Familiarize yourself and your family with these flags:

Green Flag: Low Hazard - Safe conditions.

Yellow Flag: Medium Hazard - Caution required.

Red Flag: High Hazard - Dangerous swimming conditions.

Double Red Flag: Water Closed to the Public - Stay out of the water.

Purple Flag: Dangerous Marine Life Present - Be cautious.

Respecting these flags ensures a safe and enjoyable beach vacation, preventing it from becoming a matter of life and death.

Powerful Ocean Channels: Rip currents are strong, narrow channels of water that flow swiftly from the shore out to sea. They can move at speeds of up to 8 feet per second or more.

Dangerous for Swimmers: Rip currents are hazardous for swimmers because they can pull even strong swimmers away from the safety of the shore, making it difficult to return to land.

Formation Locations: These currents are commonly formed near breaks in sandbars, inlets, jetties, and piers. They often appear as gaps or differences in water color due to the swift flow.

Safety Protocol: If caught in a rip current, it's essential not to panic and avoid swimming directly back to the shore. Instead, swim parallel to the beach until you're out of the current's pull, and then make your way to safety. Always pay attention to warning flags at the beach to stay safe.



Sunburn Prevention

The sun's rays are the strongest between 10am and 4pm. You'll burn faster during this time of the day. While in the sun, wear lightweight fabrics, wide-brimmed hats, and long loose-fitting pants and tops. Don't forget your sunglasses (your eyes can get sunburned too). Wear sunblock to protect your skin from the sun's rays and be sure to reapply the sunblock if you have been in the water or have been sweating. Remember you can burn on cloudy days also.

Sunburn Treatment

Take a cool bath or shower. Try adding a little baking soda or vinegar to your bathwater. It can help to soothe your skin. Several times a day apply Aloe Vera gel. Sunburn can be dehydrating, causing fluid loss through your skin so drink plenty of fluids. Leave blisters alone, the fluid inside acts as a protective agent for your skin. Breaking the blisters will slow healing and increase the risk of infection. Your body needs time to recover, rest, eat and drink healthy foods to give it the support it needs to heal.

Heatstroke

Heatstroke is often a result from exercise or heavy work in hot environments combined with inadequate fluid intake. The main sign of heatstroke is a markedly elevated body temperature – generally greater than 104°F (40°C) – with changes in mental status ranging from personality changes to confusion and coma. Skin may be hot and dry – although if heatstroke is caused by exertion, the skin may be moist. Other signs and symptoms may include: rapid heartbeat, rapid and shallow breathing, elevated or lowered blood pressure, cessation of sweating, irritability, confusion or unconsciousness, feeling dizzy or lightheaded, headache, nausea, fainting, which may be the first sign in older adults.

If you suspect heatstroke: Move the person out of the sun and into a shady or air-conditioned space, call 911 or emergency medical help, Cool the person by covering him or her with damp sheets or by spraying with cool water. Direct air onto the person with a fan or newspaper. Have the person drink cool water or other nonalcoholic beverage without caffeine, if he or she is able. Limit your outdoor activity to morning and evening hours and

wear lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing. Monitor young children and elderly because they are more sensitive to the heat exhaustion or heat stroke. Body temperature can rise to 106°F or higher within 10 to 15 minutes. A very important tip for summer health is to drink enough fluids. **HYDRATE**, **HYDRATE**, **HYDRATE**.

Jellyfish Stings

Symptoms Include: an intense, stinging pain, itching, rash, and raised welts. The progressive effects of a jellyfish sting may include nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, lymph node swelling, abdominal pain, numbness/tingling, and muscle spasms. Severe reactions can cause difficulty breathing, coma, and death.

Treatments include: Diphenhydramine (Benadryl) to help with the itching, pain medication for pain, and/or topical steroids or steroids by mouth to help with the swelling and itching.

Rinse in sea water,70% isopropyl alcohol, vinegar (acetic acid) for 15-30 minutes. Another common treatment is Adolph's Meat Tenderizer. Make a paste of meat tenderizer & sea water. **DO NOT USE FRESH WATER**. Fresh water will cause the nematocysts to continue to release their toxin. For the same reason, do not rub the area, apply ice or hot water. *Urine will not work on a jellyfish sting*.

Remove tentacles with a stick or a pair of tweezers. Wear gloves if you have them availabble. Apply shaving cream or a paste of baking soda to the area. Shave the area with a razor or credit card to remove any adherent nematocysts, then reapply vinegar or alcohol. The shaving cream or paste prevents nematocysts that have not been activated from releasing their toxin during removal with the razor.

Eye stings should be rinsed with a commercial saline solution like Artificial Tears; dab the skin around the eyes with a towel that has been soaked in vinegar. Do not place vinegar directly in the eyes.

Mouth stings should be treated with 1/4 strength vinegar. Mix ½ cup of vinegar with ¾ cup of water. Gargle and spit out the solution. Do not drink or swallow the solution. For pain, take acetaminophen (Tylenol) 325 mg 1-2 tablets every 4-6 hours for pain; or Ibuprofen (Motrin) or Aleve every 8 hours for pain. CPR MAY BE NECESSARY FOR ALL STINGS IF THE PERSON STOPS BREATHING AND/OR NO LONGER HAS A PULSE.

Residents and nonresidents under the age of 16 are exempt from needing a license. Residents aged 65 and over are also exempt.

Recreational License Fees-Residents of Alabama

- Saltwater Annual \$25.00 Allows a resident aged 16-63 to fish the salt waters of Alabama (Expires Aug. 31)
- Saltwater Fishing 7 Day trip \$10.40 Valid for 168 Consecutive hours. Allows a resident aged 16-64 to fish the salt waters of Alabama for a one-time period of 168 hours as selected and designated by the licensee to the issuing agent at the time of issuance.
- Fishing (Disabled) \$3.05 Allows a totally disabled resident to fish the salt and fresh waters for Alabama during their period of total disability.
- Disabled Military Veterans Appreciation Fishing \$3.15 Allows a resident aged 16-64 to fish the freshwaters of Alabama. Must be certified by the U.S. Veterans Administration to be 20% or more disabled. (Expires Aug 31)

Recreational License Fees – NON-ALABAMA RESIDENTS

- Saltwater Annual \$53.70 Required for nonresidents age 16+ (except LA), to fish the salt waters of Alabama (Expires Aug 31)
- Saltwater Trip 7- Day \$29.60 Value for 168 consecutive hours. Required for nonresidents aged 16+ (except LA) to fish the saltwater's of Alabama for a one-time period of seven consecutive days or less during those hours occurring during the then current license year for a period not to exceed 168 consecutive hours from the beginning date and time, as selected and designated by the licensee to the issuing agent at the time of issuance.

Licenses may be purchased on Dauphin Island at the Alabama Marine Resources Division. By calling **1-888-848-6887** (24 Hours) – you will be issued an authorization code for immediate use (a \$3.95 fee will be charged for all phone orders) or online at **www.outdooralabama.com**. Additional information is available on line.

The Local Fishing Spots

The Island is full of ideal inshore fishing spots that you don't need a boat to access, so you won't have any difficulties finding a good option.

Much of the **western gulf-side** is good for surf fishing and the **western sound-side** is good for wade fishing.

On the **eastern end**, there are additional fishing spots such as the **pier at Billy Goat Hole** and several spots along the **beaches** or from the **jetties**.

Sand Island, located at the Public Beach, is good for wade fishing on the **inner side** and surf fishing on the **outer gulf-side**.
